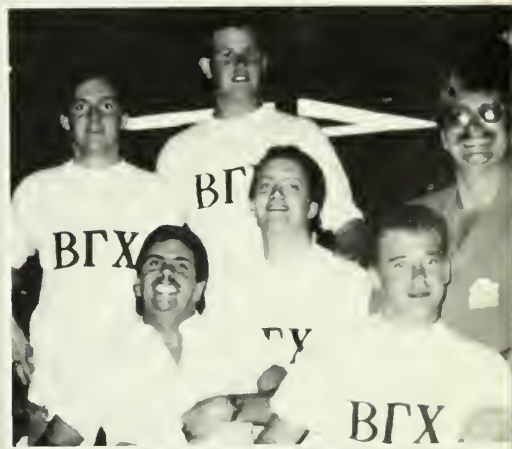

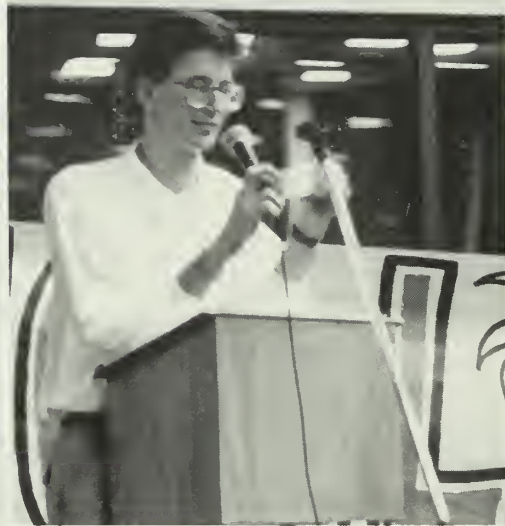


A Night Filled With X's And O's . . .

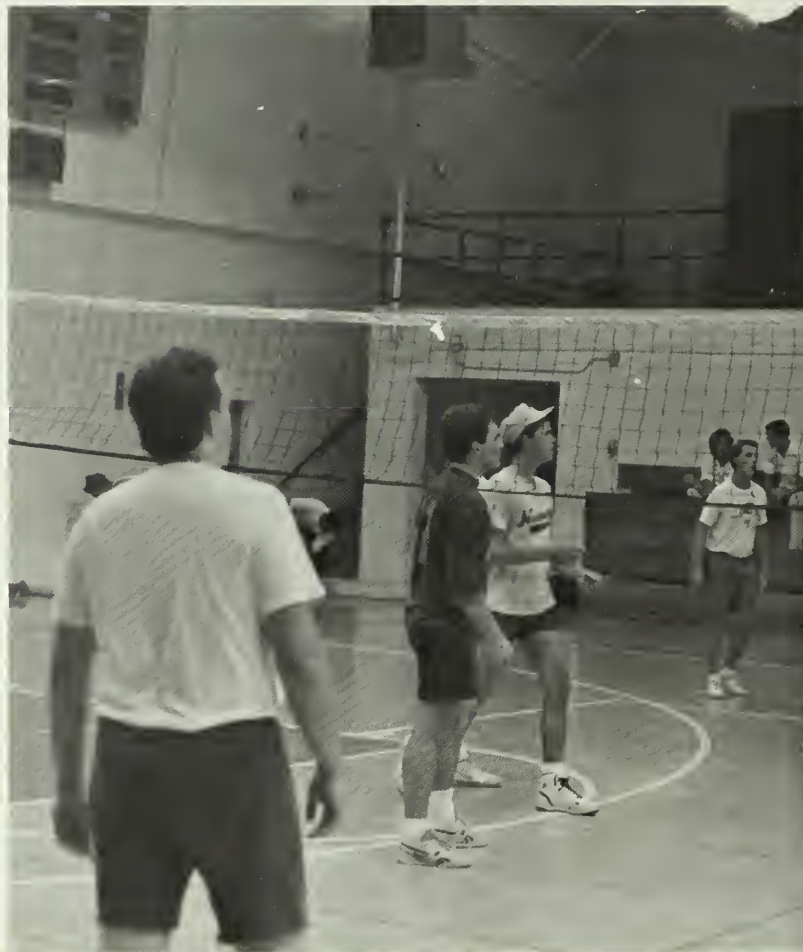

HOMECOMING 1988

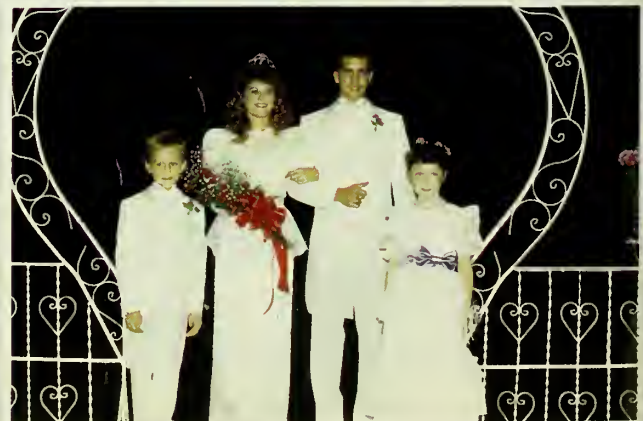
