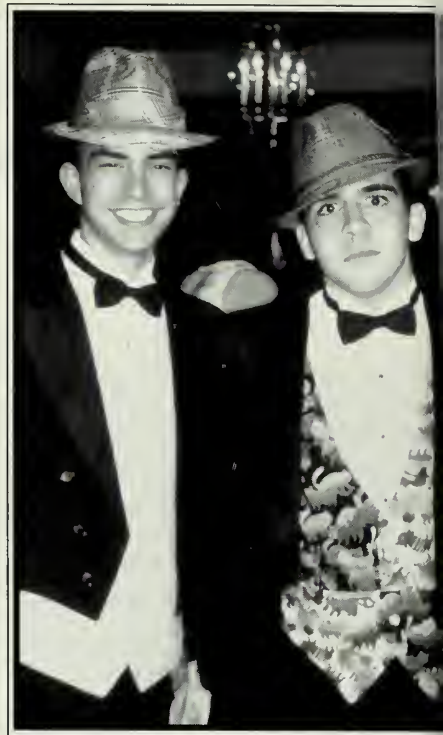

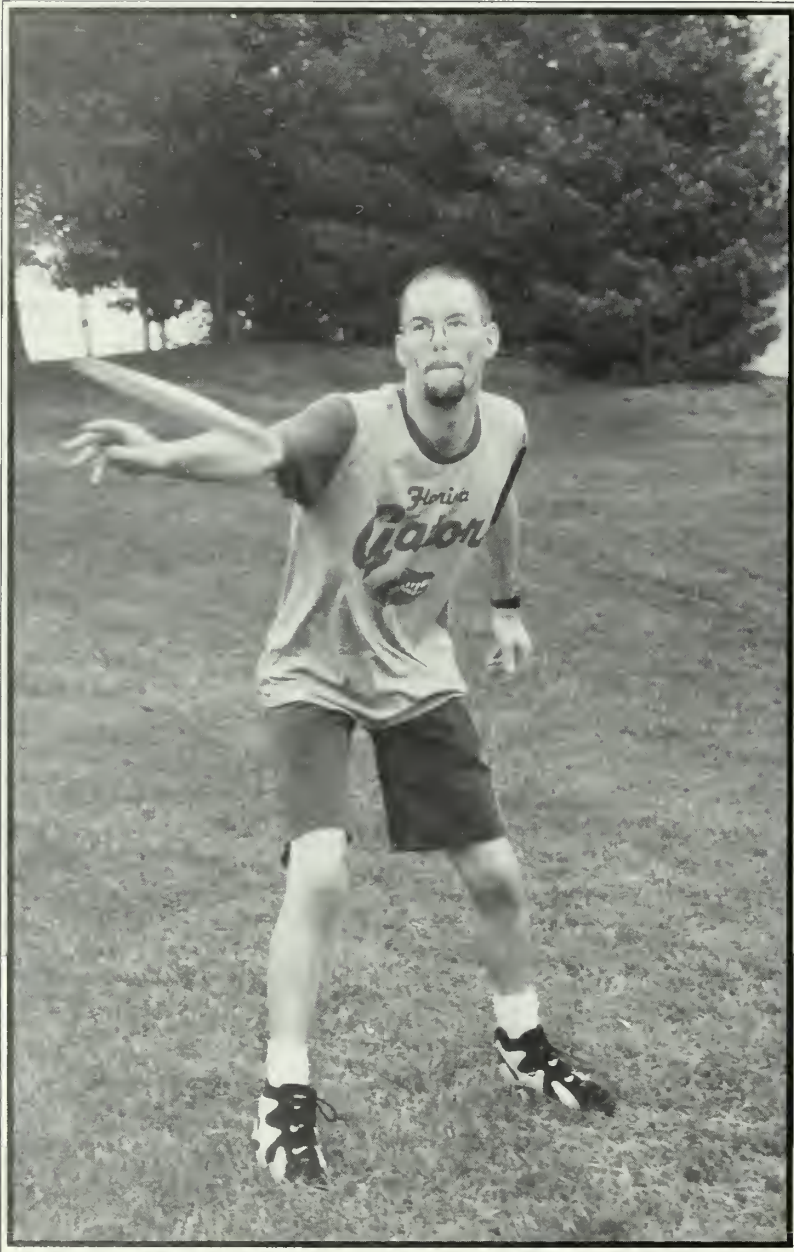

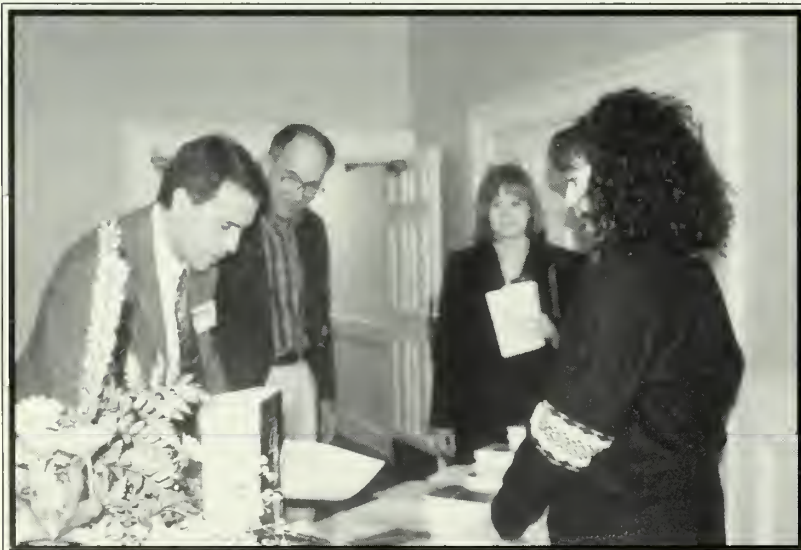
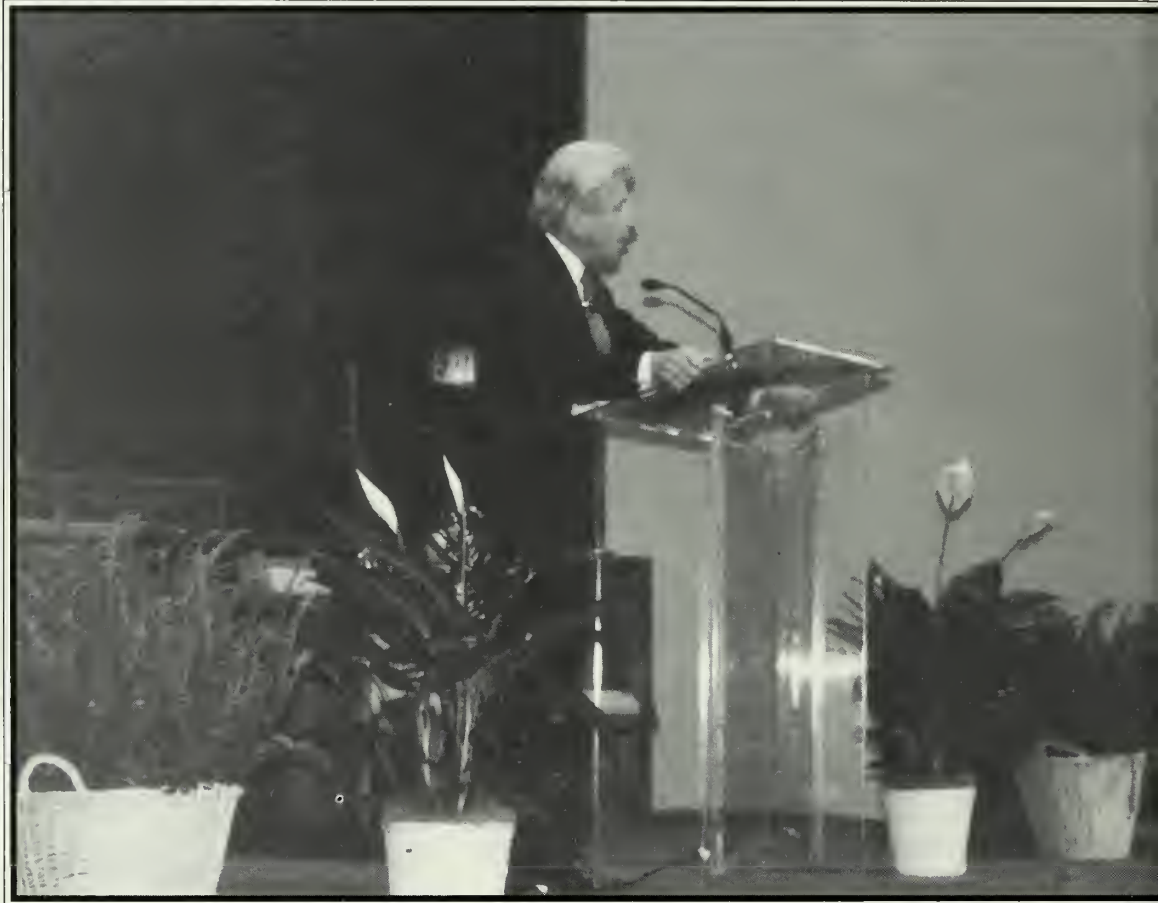


# Conference on the Family

Dr. William J. Strickland and Ms. Nancy Hazlewood, two long-time faculty members, have announced they will retire from Trevecca at the end of the spring 1998 semester.

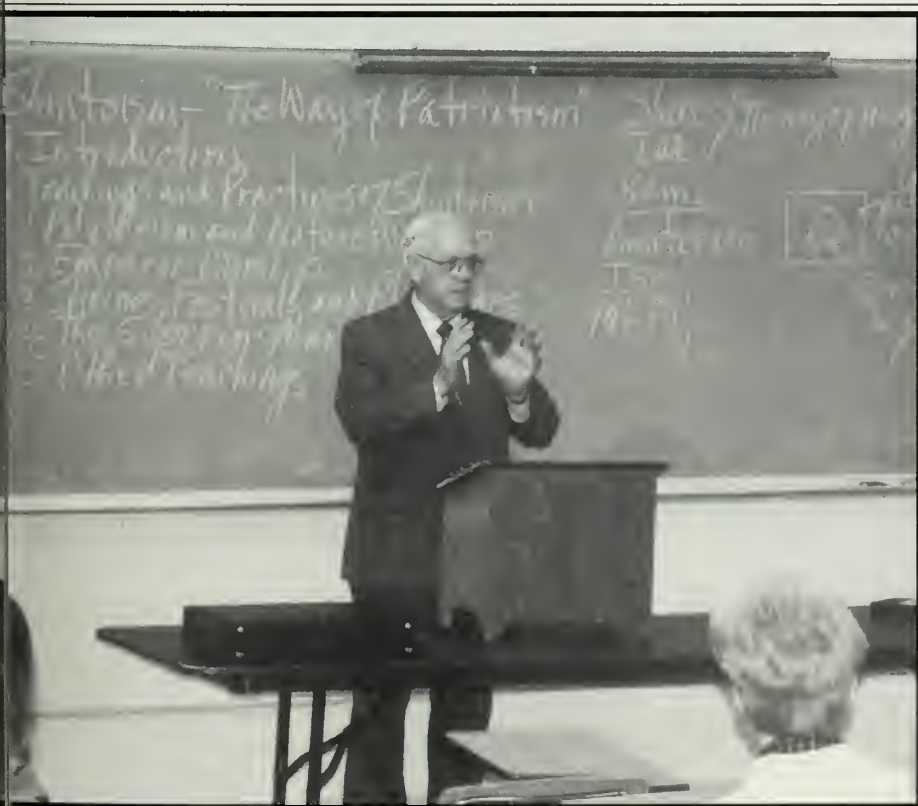
Nancy Hazlewood has been an instructor in Trevecca's Teacher Education Program since 1978. Prior to coming to Trevecca, she taught at East Tennessee State University for ten years and held several positions in the public schools.

Dr. Strickland brings to a close thirty-six years of outstanding service to Trevecca as both a faculty member and an administrator. For seventeen years, from 1974-1991 and longer than any other person, he held the position of academic dean. Prior to that term, he also served one year as dean of students. Dr. Strickland is co-author of the Centennial celebration book on J. O. McClurkan.

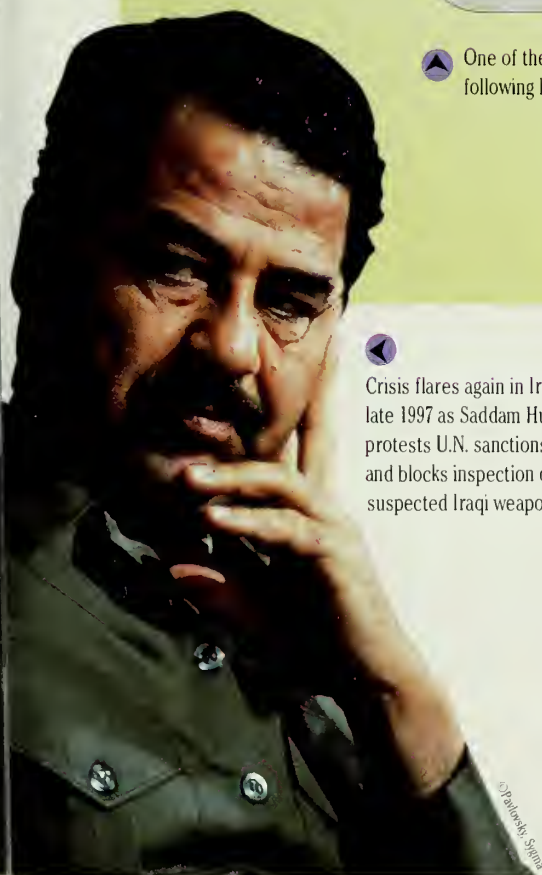

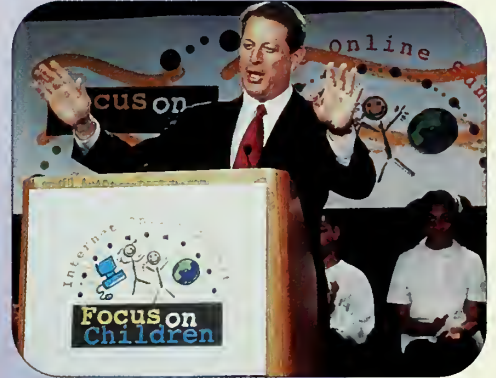

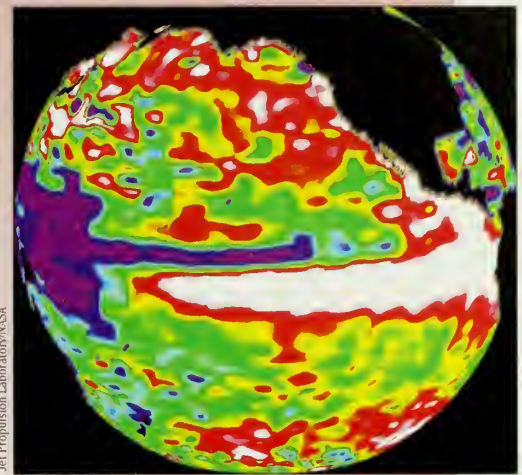

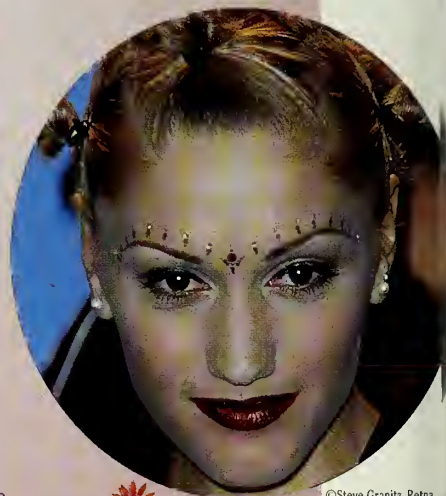

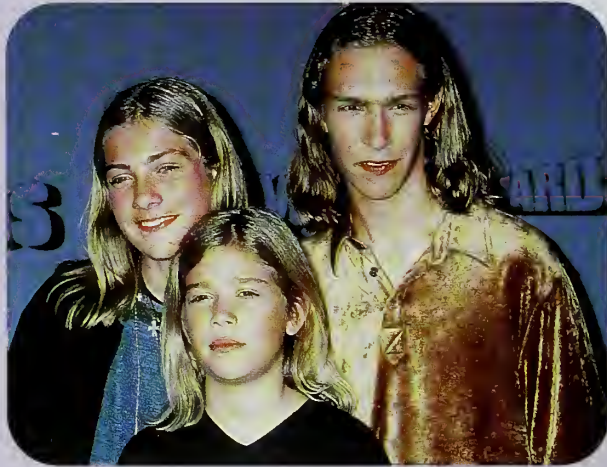

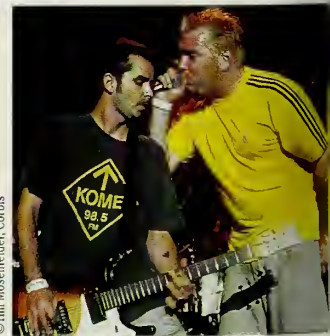

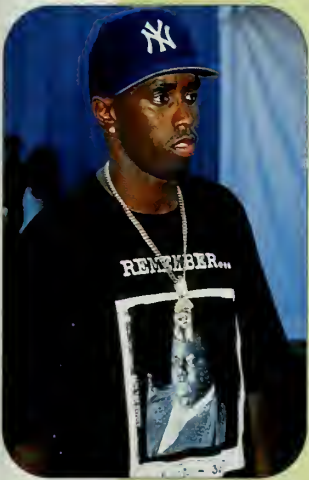

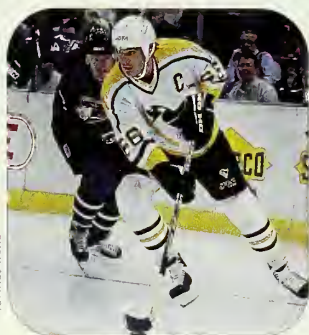

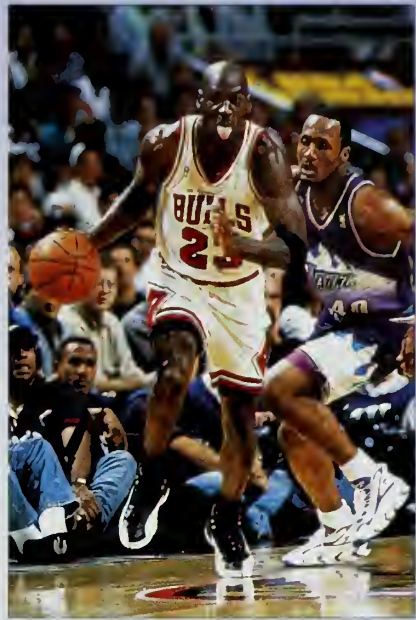
