SENIOR HOUSING REPORT Vada Lee Barkley

More than forty people attended the February 24 meeting to hear Dr. Loren Gresham, President of SNU, talk about Senior Housing.

Dr. Gresham assured us of his interest in and commitment to a senior housing facility. He asked us to determine the type of facility prospective tenants want and how they (we) want to pay for it; for example, monthly, like rent; substantial entrance fee; trust.

Elbert Overholt has begun research to follow through on that request.

Dr. Gresham and members of our senior housing committee have toured a number of retirement centers in our area.

We are collecting information on others. Some of those we will visit later.

One facility, for example, described in <u>The Daily</u> <u>Oklahoman</u>, 2-27-92, p. 13, is similar in size and type to what many of us want.

Meadowood Retirement Community near Indiana University at Bloomington, Indiana, features 92 apartments and 92 garden homes on 30 acres.

It also has a health pavilion with assisted living and skilled care.

A WORD ABOUT MEMBERSHIP

As we begin our first annual membership drive, a few quotes from our Bylaws are in order.

Art. I, Section 1. Membership qualifications:

Members shall be individuals from various professional backgrounds who, having arrived at the state of life where they no longer need to meet the pressure of regular professional activities, would like to join with others in comparable circumstances in the realization of personal and shared goals entailing various forms of intellectual, cultural, spiritual and service activities. They shall show evidence of humane concern, intellectual purpose and the ability to share and synthesize experience and expertise. Such abilities are to be shared for a reasonable period of time each year in the results of personal investigation, in individual or group projects, and in ongoing programs of the Academy.

Art. I, Section 3. Admission of New Members.

Application for membership shall be made to the Director on forms provided by the Academy to the prospective Member.

Applications shall be approved by the Committee on Membership and by members of the Academy Administrative Council.

Art. I., Section 4. Good Standing and Requirements for Continued Membership.

A member is considered to be in good standing as long as he or she has paid all dues and has satisfied any other obligations to the Academy.
