On the Campus

- 1. To leave the campus, students are expected to get permission from the appropriate dormitory dean and to sign the dean's daily register.
- 2. Resident students may not leave the city without the permission of their respective deans.
- 3. Day students while on the campus must conform to resident-student rules. Behavior of day students while away from the campus is observed and is subject to regulation.
- 4. Bells on the campus ring as follows:
- a. Rising bell, at 6:30 a.m. Students who must rise earlier for industrial work are requested to remain as quiet as possible.
 - b. Breakfast bell, at 7:00 a.m.
- c. Class bells for college students ring on the hour; tardy bells, five minutes later.
- d. Chapel bells ring at 10:55 and 11:00 a.m. for opening and at 11:45 a.m. for closing the exercises.
 - e. Study bell rings at 7:00 p.m.
 - f. Study dismissal bell, at 9:30 p.m.
 - g. Lights-out bell rings at 10:30 p.m.
- h. Wednesday evening prayermeeting bell rings at 7:30 p.m.; bells for all other prayermeetings, at 6:15 p.m.
- i. Friday evening social period bells ring at 7:30 p.m. and 10:30 p.m.
- j. Sunday evening social period bells ring at 5:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m.





Many seasons have come and gone while I have been at 'Frevecca-different kinds of seasons both in my life and the life of the school.

When I came to TNC in the summer of '73 my wife and I had three small boys. 'We added a girl in '77. Now they are all grown and married and we have nine grandchildren. In those early days I had lots of hair and two good legs. I too have changed.

There have been a lot of changes at TNU over the years. I have worked under three presidents of the college, seen three buildings taken down and three new ones added. I have worked under three deans of the college and five department heads. My office has been moved five times. And there have been many, many students who have worked for me and student leaders I have worked with. We moved lots of 16mm and filmstrip projectors around in those early days. Now it's TVs and data projectors.

I have enjoyed working at Trevecca. More seasons will come and go. More students, faculty, and administrators will come and leave. The only thing that doesn't change is God. Psalm 121:1-3,7&8 says:

A physician assistant (PA) is a skilled health practitioner qualified by academic and clinical experience to provide a broad range of medical services under the direction and supervision of a licensed physician. PAs, working with physicians, provide s broad range of services in a variety of practice settings from rural communities to metropolitan areas.

The physician assistant degree, established in 1976, was developed to train assistants to the primary care physician to work in areas of Christian service in the United States and in the field of mission service abroad. The PA Department at Trevecca is fully accredited by the Commision on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP) and is the only accredited PA training program in Tennessee. An entering class of 33 students is selected annually to begin studies in August. The department welcomes students of other religious affiliations who subscribe to the ideals of the University and who qualify under its standards.

The requirements for the Pastoral Ministry track are designed to meet the requirements for ordination as elder in the Church of the Nazarene. Likewise, the requirements for the Christian education, youth ministry and worship ministry tracks are designed to meet the requirements for deacon's orders in the Church of the Nazarene. The division serves the University in the general education area by providing introductory level courses in Bible, doctrine and philosophy as well as a senior seminar designed to integrate faith, learning, and Christian living. 

"In the mid-1940s, one of the major concerns on Trevecca's campus had to do with student life. There had been a movement on the part of the students for student organizations and self-government. This was considered dangerous by some members of the faculty and administration, but several administrators including Dr. A.B. Mackey held different views. In 1944, the first steps were taken toward student government. A Student Advisory Council was authorized. One person from each of the college classes, the high school, and Department of Religion was elected to this council. Margaret Doggett was elected president of the Council and became the first student representative to the Administration. Although the authority of the Student Government was very limited, in comparison with Student Government today, it became the first contact of the students as a whole with the faculty."





Next year, we at TNU look forward to an exciting second season under the new coaching staff.








